

Getting started with Kobo® tablets

You can use the OverDrive app to get eBooks, audiobooks, streaming videos, and periodicals from your library on your Kobo tablet, such as the Kobo Vox or Arc.

NOTE: Some digital formats may not be available from all libraries.

STEP 1



Download the OverDrive app from the Google Play store or app.overdrive.com

STEP 2



Open the OverDrive app and follow the prompts to create an OverDrive account and log in. If you're under 13, select **I am under 13 years old** instead.

NOTE: If you're using a Kobo Vox, skip this step and move on to step 3.

STEP 3



In the OverDrive app, find your library's OverDrive website. On most Kobo tablets, you can do this by swiping from left to right to open the **Home menu**, then tapping **Add**. On a Kobo Vox, tap the  icon (or, if you don't have this icon, go to **Menu > Get Books**).

- Tap the  to save your library to your library list.
- Tap your library's name to start browsing.

Log into your library's OverDrive website with your library card and borrow a title.
